1 INTRODUCTION AND PURPOSE OF THIS DOCUMENT

This manual grants access to records held by Shelley Point Hotel Spa & Country Club (Pty) Ltd: The Shelley Point Hotel & Spa, (Company Registration Number: 2008/028141/07), hereinafter referred to as 'The Company' or 'The Shelley Point Hotel & Spa'.

2 BUSINESS OVERVIEW

The Company performs its activities as a private body as defined in the Act and provides its services and products to its customers under the Hospitality industry. 7 RECORDS AUTOMATICALLY AVAILABLE

Records obtained by the body includes towards terms of Government requirements with numerous statutory bodies, including the Companies and Intellectual Property Commission are automatically accessible in terms of legislation.

8 PURPOSE OF PROCESSING OF PERSONAL INFORMATION

The company processes information for various purposes including but not limited to: employee and management information, sales and promotion initiatives, customer care processes and interacting with clients directly.





9 DATA SUBJECT CATEGORIES AND THEIR PERSONAL INFORMATION

Overall public – tracking universal enquiries and web site visits; Investors – records as maintained by the Company Secretary [if applicable], and Media – records of media connections.

Employees – private information relating to the employment cycle of an employee;

Suppliers – personal information of traders including business essentials;

Customers – personal information of customers which are used for advertising initiatives;

10 PLANNED TRANS-BORDER FLOWS OF PERSONAL INFORMATION

The Company does not partake in any cross-border related activities of information that is sent out of the borders of the RSA.

11 PLANNED RECIPIENTS OF PERSONAL INFORMATION (NON-EXHAUSTIVE LIST)

Financial institutions – First National Bank related information, Standard Bank related information, , Nedbank related information,

Medical schemes and service providers – Medical Scheme related documentation where applicable in the operations of the body,

Statutory authorities – the Consumer Goods Council, the Department of Labour, the UIF State Body, the South African Revenue Service;

Employee pension and provident funds – The body obtains such information where applicable; and

Industry bodies - various.





12 SECURITY MEASURES TO PROTECT PERSONAL INFORMATION

The company realizes and understand the value of personal information and will take all rational steps to ensure the safeguard of all the information within the body and will to the best of its abilities prevent information from being lost, misuse, or unauthorized accessed. The Company understands its obligation to:

- · Implement physical and electronic access control to its premises and systems; and
- only authorize access to information to those employees who require it to fulfil their designated responsibilities;
- protect and manage information that it holds about its stakeholders; and
- make use of electronic and computer safeguards, such as firewalls and data encryption, to secure stakeholders' information.

The Company is dedicated to use suitable technical and other security procedures in line with acceptable industry ethics, to safeguard stakeholders' information.

13 DETAIL ON HOW TO MAKE A REQUEST FOR ACCESS

The requester must complete Annexure A below and submit this form together with a request fee, to the labeled Information Officer. The form must be submitted to the designated Information Officer of the Company at his/ her physical or electronic mail address, as stated earlier in this manual.

Form of request:

The requester must provide sufficient detail on the request form to enable the designated head to identify the record and the requester.

The requester should indicate which form of access is required.

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The requester should indicate if any other manner is to be used to inform the requester and state the necessary particulars to be so informed [s 53(2)(a) and (b) and (c)] of PAIA.

The requester must identify the right that is sought to be exercised or to be protected and provide an explanation of why the requested record is required for the exercise or protection of that right [s 53(2)(d)] of PAIA.

If a request is made on behalf of another person, the requester must then submit proof of the capacity in which the requester is making the request to the satisfaction of the designated head of the private body [s 53(2)(f)] of PAIA.

A requester who seeks admission to a record containing private information about that requester is not required to pay the request fee.

Every additional requester, who is not a personal requester, must pay the required request fee.

The designated head of the private body must notify the requester (other than a personal requester) by notice, requiring the requester to pay the prescribed fee (if any) before further processing the request [s 54(1)] of PAIA.

The fee that the requester must pay to a private body is currently R50, 00. The requester may lodge an application to the court against the tender or payment of the request fees 54(3)(b)] of PAIA.

After the nominated head of the private body has provided a response on the initiated request, the requester must be informed accordingly in the required form.





If the request is granted further access, the prescribed fee must be paid for the search, reproduction, preparation and for any time that has exceeded the prescribed hours to search and prepare the record for disclosure [s 54(6)] of PAIA.

14 GROUNDS FOR REFUSING A REQUEST

The Company has the right to deny access to records on one or more of the grounds outlined in Chapter 4 of the Act pertaining to: "Grounds for Refusal of Access to Records".

15 AVAILABILITY OF THE MANUAL

Copies of this manual are available for inspection at the designated Information Officer of the Company and copies can be made available free of charge.

Requests for information must be submitted in accordance with the prescribed format and must be accompanied by the prescribed fee as indicated herein.

Printing per A4 page	75 cents
Copy on a CD/memory stick (4 GB)	R70
Transcription of visual images per A4 page	R40
Copy of a visual image	R60
Transcription of an audio recording per A4 page	R20
Search and preparation of the record for disclosure	R30 per hour or part thereof, excluding the first hour, reasonably required for the search and preparation.
